

1. The Preface & The Correct View:

Summary:

If we're to effect global change, we must first see Christ as Lord over this world and we, the followers of Christ, as His agents of change. Our global worship in sound and reach, coupled with our transformative work, changes and affects every area of life for the glory of God!

Discussion Questions:
